Get the Facts: Why should I be concerned about lead?



Make your friends and family aware that lead poisoning is still a problem in our area. Oneida County has one of the highest levels of childhood lead poisoning in New York State, and Herkimer County levels are double the state average. Utica's incidence rate of elevated blood lead levels of children in recent years was greater than Flint, Michigan at the time of its well-known lead-related water crisis. Get Your Soil Tested: How do I know if there is lead in my yard?

Get Your Child Tested: How do I know if my child was exposed to lead?



Make sure your child is tested at age 1 and 2 since a simple blood test can detect lead. NYS Law requires all children be tested for lead at age 1 and again at age 2 by their doctor or health care provider. Make sure your child has had a lead test. If they need a lead test and you don't have a doctor that you see regularly, there are clinics in Utica where they do lead testing on site. Learn more at www.leadfreemv.org/facts.

Get Your Home Tested: How can I make sure my child is safe at home?



Make your home safer by having your living space tested for lead. Find out if you qualify for assistance through the Lead Safe Utica Program. Eligible families must live in Utica, have a home built prior to 1978, have a child under age 6 spending significant time in the home, and must meet income guidelines.
